From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents,

Welcome to another school year! I sincerely hope your families have enjoyed a peaceful and relaxing summer with quality family time. In addition to welcoming back our returning families, this year we are so pleased to welcome 37 new families to our school community (21 in preschool and 16 in K-8). This enrollment growth represents a 7.0% increase in our K-8 program over the last year! Along with welcoming new students and families, we are also excited to welcome 10 new staff members whose biographies are on pages 3-5 of this newsletter. Although the halls have been quiet, there is a great energy and excitement that can be felt around the school campus as staff have been preparing all summer for another prosperous year of growth and discovery with your children.

This year we enter year 2 of the 7-year school improvement process. We have collected data to target specific goals as we move forward making enhancements to the school. End-of-year parent survey data has been most helpful in identifying these goals. Upon reviewing the data and with the advice of School Board, four goals were identified at the beginning of summer and we are proud of the advances made in just a few months. Below is a list of the targeted growth opportunities followed by improvements made over the summer.

- Safety & security
- Student health (mental & physical)
- Communication
- Report cards

School Safety & Security: With the advice of a security consultant, we are implementing a 32 camera security system to monitor the entire campus and have installed the first 6 cameras in the school. We have further restricted access to the school by installing an electrical locking system which only allows those who have been previously granted access the ability to enter the door without being buzzed in. We have implemented a new visitor sign-in system that will require all visitors to scan their driver's license upon entering the school and wear a photo ID visitor pass that will be generated by this system. We have also improved classroom security by installing a shatterproof film to classroom door windows and installed a lockdown system on each door which barricades the students and teacher in the classroom, making it nearly impossible for an intruder to gain access to a classroom from inside the school. Lastly, all of our staff will receive training in how to respond to a school intruder before the start of the year. We will continue working with the consultant to see how we can further our school safety and security.

Student Health: We are very pleased to be able to increase the amount of time our school counselor, Mrs. Diven, is here from two days a week to three days. This will allow her to meet more frequently with students in need of counseling, as well as conduct classroom activities and presentations to promote the virtues, character education, and combat social injustices. Mrs. Diven will be at school Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. Our new school nurse, Mrs. Dalton, will be an added asset to the school as well in assessing and managing student health issues and staff training.

Communication: Last year the school staff focused on improving communication via social media and re-doing and updating the <u>school website</u>. This year we will focus on consistent weekly class communications regarding homework, assignments, tests, and upcoming events from homeroom/advisory teachers and monthly communications from specialty teachers.

Report Cards: Please look for a brief follow-up parent survey in the coming months with options and example report cards that would be possible for the future.

This year we are moving to a new Waste Management Recycling Program to enhance the school's sustainability efforts to care for the environment. Students and staff will be trained on how this program will work and what items to recycle.

We have added our third and final <u>Project Lead The Way</u> (<u>PLTW</u>) course to our Upper School Program. The new course is called <u>Medical Detectives</u>. Among other skills, students will dissect an animal brain and learn the art of DNA decoding to solve a crime scene. This course is in addition to our <u>Design & Modeling</u> and <u>Automation & Robotics</u> courses. Our new STEM Specialist, Mr. Riley, received training and certification this summer to teach the new course.

The entire school has been stripped down, cleaned, and ready for students and staff!

We have switched to a new technology support company, <u>GadellNet</u>, that will work with school staff to further enhance our technology systems and ensure functionality of all devices.

We are pleased to continue partnering with QAS parent, Amy Voegtli, for the second year to offer a Reading Intervention Program to students needing extra help in reading. Mrs. Voegtli is a Literacy Coach for the U-City School District.

Mrs. Key was awarded a scholarship this summer to tour the famous Ron Clark Academy School in Atlanta, Georgia this school year! This school is known by educators around the world for its state of the art curriculum. Teachers and I attended a workshop with the principal last year. Mrs. Key sent her a letter after the event and received a scholarship in response! It will be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for her and the entire QAS faculty. Congratulations Mrs. Key!

We are looking forward to seeing everyone again in a few weeks. We will keep you in our prayers – please keep us in yours as well as we begin the new year,
