FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This past Sunday as a parish we were proud to host the Eagle Scout Court of Honor for Jacob Kurkowski. On achieving this rank, he joins 60 young men from our parish who proudly wear the Eagle Scout's badge. Jacob's project consisted of collecting shoes for the Shoeman Water Project. Its main focus is to provide clean water in communities in developing countries. They generate revenue by collecting new and gently used shoes. Our shoe collection efforts improve our planet by keeping wearable, usable shoes out of local landfills and directing them to a secondary market for reuse both locally and globally. Jacob collected a little over 1800 pairs of shoes. In his remarks, Jacob thanked many people for their role in helping him to achieve this rank. Most importantly his words to his parents were touching as he thanked them for their strong support.

We welcomed last Sunday the young men and women of our parish who will this coming week begin a new academic year. As we blessed their backpacks we could not help but recall that soon they will be filled with books, pens, binders and homework assignments. I would encourage you to please keep all of the students in our parish in your prayers.

On Monday evening, many of our new kindergarteners will go to bed dreaming of their first day of school and what adventures might lie ahead. For our older students, there may be some excitement to see their friends again, but some sadness as the fun and freedom of summer comes to an end. It is with great joy on Tuesday that we will be able to welcome all new students and returning students.

Please mark your calendars for August 27th, which is our next Parish Night Out. In May, June, and July, we have gathered near the concession stand and on the fields to join each other for an evening of fun. Everyone is welcome, and for our fourth and final Parish Night Out of the year there will be live music. I encourage you to make plans to attend this fun evening.

On Monday, August 15th, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which this year is not a Holy Day of Obligation because it falls on a Monday. Thus, the Mass schedule for that day will remain unchanged. Why is this feast day important to us? The Feast of the Assumption is above all a mystery of hope and joy for all of us: in Mary we see the destination for which we are bound, for all who can interpret their life according to the life of Jesus, and who are able to follow him as Mary did. This Feast, then, speaks of our future. It tells us that we, too, shall be beside Jesus in God's joy. — Msgr. Breier

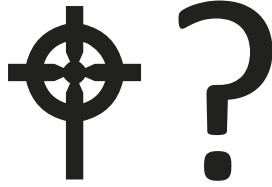

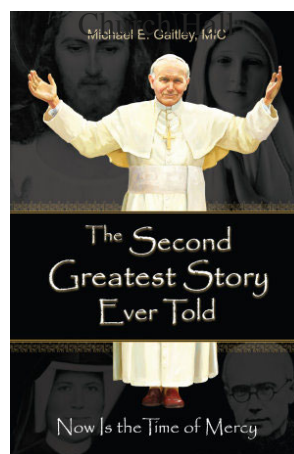

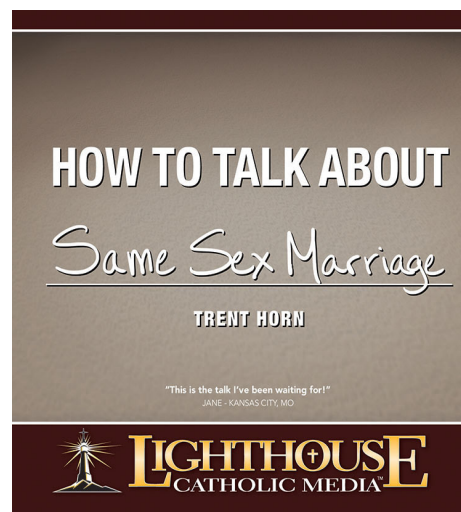
