TECH SAFETY

How often do you check your child(ren)'s electronic devices?
Checking their electronics regularly can save them from danger—here's a list of dangerous apps being used by children:

Yik Yak – the anonymous social wall for anything and everything

Tinder – helps people find others in their geographic location and allows users to view each other's photos and instant messages

Ask.fm – easy place for cyberbullying that has been linked to suicides

Kik Messenger – linked to sexting and cyberbullying

Voxer – walkie-talkie type app that allows users to quickly exchange short voice messages – linked to cyberbullying

Snapchat – allows users to send photos and videos that disappear from viewing within 10 seconds after they're received

Poke – similar to Snapchat, gaining popularity – photos self destruct within seconds after received

Whisper – shows users' geographic location and lets them setup anonymous accounts to share secrets, express yourself, and meet new people
